What are the requirements of an academy?

1. achieve at least five 9-7 GCSE grades (A*-A in unreformed subjects)
2. achieve a grade 6 or above in both GCSE Mathematics and English Language.
3. achieve at least a 9-7 grade in the GCSE subjects they wish to continue to study at A level in Year 12 and meet minimum course requirements.
