What is the difference between label and text in Revit?

It is smart text that is calling out for specific information such as name, project, job number, etc. Labels are built into a loadable family and used within the family to display information for the family and in the project environment when used. The information that is called out is called a Parameter.

What is generic model control?

Generic Model Control (GMC) is a new control method developed by the authors that directly imbeds a process model in the control algorithm. The process model is usually a nonlinear description of the process derived from fundamental mass and energy balance considerations.

What is generic data type?

Definition: "A generic type is a generic class or interface that is parameterized over types." Essentially, generic types allow you to write a general, generic class (or method) that works with different types, allowing for code re-use.

What is generic control?

A generic control is a description of a control that can be performed in your organisation. Generic controls can be scheduled and performed as control tasks through the Project management module.

How many types of families are there in Revit?

We can classify all Revit families into three different types: System families, loadable families, and in place families. In most cases, system families are typically assemblies of multiple components and layers.

What are Revit categories?

Category: this is located at the top of the hierarchy within the Revit families. Categories control the organisation, visibility, graphical representation and scheduling options of a particular set of families within the project. Examples of categories are doors, windows, columns, ducts, etc.

What is host in Revit?

Host Element – An element that can receive or support or provide structure for other model elements (built in-place construction). Component Element – An item inserted into a project (items that are pre-manufactured, purchased and installed).

What are generics used for?

In a nutshell, generics enable types (classes and interfaces) to be parameters when defining classes, interfaces and methods. Much like the more familiar formal parameters used in method declarations, type parameters provide a way for you to re-use the same code with different inputs.

How do I Create a generic annotation schedule in Revit?

1. Load the generic annotation family or families into your model and place them where desired.
2. Click View tab Create panel Schedules drop-down Note Block.
3. In the New Note Block dialog, for Family, select a generic annotation.

How do you draft faster in Revit?

1. Use keyboard shortcuts.
2. Master left and right crossing selections and pair this with the Filter Selection tool.
3. Use Paste Aligned to Current View to quickly duplicate drafting items and annotations.
4. Use two monitors.

The programmer defines the initial type and then lets the code do its job. It allows us to implement non-generic algorithms.
