Introduction

If you save an action **macro**, you must specify a name and optionally, a description and playback settings for the action **macro**. 1 On the ribbon, click Tools tab → Action Recorder panel → Stop.

Amazingly, why is there a red dot beside my cursor in AutoCAD? A red dot by your cursor indicates you are **recording**.

Also know, how do I edit an action macro in AutoCAD? To edit the macro, select it in the Available Action Macro drop-down. Then, expand the Action Recorder panel and pin it open. It is helpful to also drag the bottom of the panel to make it bigger so you can see more of the macro without having to do as much scrolling.

Subsequently, what recording mode do you use to record directly from your computer?

In this regard, how do I get rid of red circles in **AutoCAD**? **AutoCAD** displays a red dot (ball) next to my crosshair cursor – why? This icon (badge) indicates that a **macro** is being recorder with the Action recorder. You can stop recording using the ribbon Manage > Action recorder > **Stop**.

How do I turn off snapping in AutoCAD?

1. 1 On the status bar, right-click the Object Snap button and click Settings.
2. 2 In the Drafting Settings dialog box, Object Snap tab, click Clear All and then select:
3. 3 Click OK.

What are macros in AutoCAD?

A macro defines the action that should be performed when a user interface element is used. It can be as simple as a command (such as circle) and include special characters (such as ^C^C). For example, the macro ^C^C_. circle 1 , draws a circle with a radius of 1 unit.

How do I run a macro in CAD?

In AutoCAD select Tools –> Macro –> Load Project and open the desired . dvb file. You can then enter the specified AutoCAD Command to run the macro. Optionally, after loading the project, you may select Tools –> Macro –> Macros, select the loaded macro, and then click on the Run button.

How do I record a macro in AutoCAD VBA?

Load the macro recorder (DVB) with VBALOAD and then run the –>Record–> macro with VBARUN. In AutoCAD 2009, 2010, 2011 (and higher) you can use the automatic Action Recorder functionality. Alas, it does not use the VBA format for storing the recorder macros.

How do you record on your laptop?

1. Windows: Shift+F9.
2. Mac: Control+Shift+Spacebar.

How do I screen record?

1. Swipe down twice from the top of your screen.
2. Tap Screen record . You might need to swipe right to find it.
3. Choose what you want to record and tap Start. The recording begins after the countdown.
4. To stop recording, swipe down from the top of the screen and tap the Screen recorder notification .

How do you record on a PC?

Click the Start Recording button or use the Win + Alt + R keyboard shortcut to capture your screen activity. Now perform whatever screen actions you want to capture.

How do you Unhatch in AutoCAD?

1. Double-click the hatch pattern (not the hatch boundary).
2. The Hatch Editor will open. Click Pick Points.
3. Type S in the Command line and press Enter.
4. The cursor will turn into a pickbox. Select each of the internal areas where you want to remove the hatch.

How do I get rid of the blue circle in AutoCAD?

Click the button shown below, and turn on ALL of the available status bar buttons. Then you'll find the one for 3D Object Snap and you can turn that off. See also.

What is Regen in AutoCAD?

REGEN command description: Regenerates the current viewport. You can run the REGEN command in any localized version of AutoCAD by typing _REGEN in the commandline.

What does a little red circle mean in AutoCAD?

if you made hatch. and during this red circles appeared its mean your hatched area is. broked somewhere.

How do I get normal cursor in AutoCAD?

1. Right-click in an empty place in the drawing area and choose Options or click Application button > Options.
2. On the Selection tab, change the Pickbox Size by moving the slider.
3. On the Display tab, change the Crosshair Size by entering a number or moving the slider.

How do you deselect in AutoCAD?

How to deselect all in AutoCAD? If you have selected objects by mistake and you want to deselect all objects, then just press the "Esc" key.

How do I turn snapping off?

How do I turn off grid snap?

1. Click the shape or object in the worksheet.
2. Under Drawing Tools on the Format tab, in the Arrange group, click Align.
3. Depending on which options are selected click Snap to Grid or Snap to Shape to disable these options.
