

# How to copy worksets in revit?

## Description

Generally Autodesk® **Revit**® users have to manually create worksets, This tool will enable you to use any file which contains your old worksets to **copy** the worksets names from it. The Copy Worksets from Files add-in is brought to you by BIM WhatsApp. It's priced at 2.99 USD. This add-in is compatible with Revit 2017.

Moreover, how do I add **worksets** in Revit?

1. Open your local copy of the central model.
2. Click Collaborate tab Manage Collaboration panel (Worksets).
3. In the Worksets dialog, click New.
4. In the New Workset dialog, enter a name for the new workset.
5. To display the workset in all project views, select Visible in all views.
6. Click OK.

Subsequently, where are **Revit Worksets**? In the Manage tab, select Manage Links, click on the correct Revit link and then click on Manage Worksets. You can then close every worksets you don't want to see. In this case we would close Shared Levels and Grids from the linked model, solving the problem above.

Amazingly, how do I add **worksets**? To create **worksets**, first switch to the Collaborate ribbon and click **Worksets**. Revit displays the Worksets dialog. As you can see, there are already two worksets: Shared Levels and Grids and Workset1. These are the two default worksets that are automatically created when you first enable worksharing.

People ask also, how do I change the owner of a workset in Revit?

1. Start **Revit** and close any open project.
2. Click the File tab > Options.
3. On the General category of the Options dialog box, enter the username of the user whose workset you want to relinquish in the Username box.

## How do you check worksets in Revit?

To check out a workset, make it editable. Note: To edit an element or a workset, it must be up-to-date. If you attempt to edit an element or a workset that is not up-to-date, you are prompted to update your local copy of the central model, so that you have all of the latest changes.

## How do Revit Worksets work?

When you make a workset editable in Revit, you are taking exclusive ownership of all objects in it. Only one user can exclusively edit each workset at a given time. All team members can view worksets owned by other team members, but they cannot always make changes to them.

## How do you change active worksets in Revit?

Switch to the View ribbon, expand the User Interface button, and select Status Bar “ Worksets. The Worksets toolbar displays the name of the active workset. You can expand the list to view all of the available worksets, and you can easily change the active workset by selecting it in this list.

## How do you copy a screen in Revit?

1. Click Copy/Monitor tab Tools panel (Copy).
2. Select the elements to copy. To select multiple elements, on the Options Bar, select Multiple. Then select the elements in the drawing area, and click Finish on the Options Bar.
3. Click Copy/Monitor tab Copy/Monitor panel (Finish).

## Why do you use worksets in Revit?

In short, Worksets is a collaborative tool in Revit that provides an element of control to what people are working on. This feature is only available within a central model for collaborative working.

## Why are Worksets important in Revit?

PLAN WORKSETS Use worksets when you want to reserve parts of a project so that only the assigned user can edit the elements in that workset. Dividing a project into worksets makes it easier to make whole sections of a project editable at once.

## How do you assign objects to worksets?

1. In the drawing area, select an element.
2. On the Properties palette, locate the Workset parameter under Identity Data.
3. Click in the Value column for the parameter, and select a new workset.

## How do I manage a workset in Revit?

To control the worksets in the linked project, select the linked file and then click Manage Worksets. Revit displays the Manage Worksets for Link dialog. Here, you can select one or more linked worksets and change their Opened status. This is the same dialog that would have been displayed if you had

selected Specifyâ€¦

## How do I create a view template in Revit?

1. In the Project Browser, select the view from which you want to create the view template.
2. Click View tab Graphics panel View Templates drop-down Create Template from Current View, or right-click and select Create View Template From View.
3. In the New View Template dialog, enter a name for the template, and click OK.

## How do you relinquish all worksets in Revit?

1. Start Revit or close any open projects.
2. Click R menu (or File menu) > Options.
3. On the General tab of the Options dialog box:
4. Create new local file (File > Open > select the central file).
5. Click Collaborate tab on the ribbon > Relinquish All Mine.

## How do you check out a workset?

If you want to take ownership of a workset without opening the Worksets dialog, you can select an element in the workset you want to check out, right-click, and select Make Worksets Editable.

## How do you rename a workset in Revit?

1. Click Collaborate tab Manage Collaboration panel (Worksets).
2. In the Worksets dialog, select the name of the workset and click Rename.
3. In the Rename dialog, enter a new name.
4. Click OK twice.

## Where can you set the default visibility of worksets?

1. Click Collaborate tab Manage Collaboration panel (Worksets).
2. Under Visible in all views, select the check box to show a workset in project views, or clear the check box to hide it.

## How do I edit a workset?

1. Select an active workset, using one of the following methods:
2. If you want all elements that are not in the active workset to be gray, click Collaborate tab Manage Collaboration panel (Gray Inactive Worksets).
3. Edit or add elements in the workset, as necessary.

## **When worksharing is enabled on a Revit project what Worksets are created by default?**

When you enable worksharing, Revit creates default worksets and assigns project elements and settings to these worksets. The default worksets are: User-created. Revit creates 2 default user-created worksets.

## **What does editable workset mean in Revit?**

When you make a workset editable in Revit, you are taking exclusive ownership of all objects in it. Only one user can exclusively edit each workset at a given time. All team members can view worksets owned by other team members, but they cannot always make changes to them.

## **How do you use the Copy command in Revit?**

If you want to copy an object multiple times, select the object, type CO (the Revit keyboard shortcut for Copy) and before copying the object go to the ribbon and check "Multiple". It is that simple, once you've checked this, Revit will behave like AutoCAD and will let you copy an object multiple times.

## **How do you copy a grid link in Revit?**

Select the elements to copy. To select multiple elements, on the Options Bar, select Multiple. Then select the elements in the drawing area, and click Finish on the Options Bar. You can use a selection box and a filter to select elements in the linked model.

## **How do I copy monitor plumbing fixtures in Revit?**
