

How to get orthographic view in sketchup?

Description

Sketchup is one of the most popular CAD applications used in companies around the world. This CAD software continues to be a popular and valued CAD alternative; many consider it the industry standard all-purpose engineering tool.

And here is the answer to your How to get orthographic view in sketchup? question, read on.

Introduction

Open the views tray from the right side toolbar (looks like an old movie clap-board). In the left-hand stripe of the views tray you can select parallel projection. A parallel projection (or axonometric projection) is a projection of an object in three-dimensional space onto a fixed plane, known as the projection plane or image plane, where the rays, known as lines of sight or projection lines, are parallel to each other. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Parallel_projection "Wikipedia (looks like an isometric view of a cube). There are buttons for standard view directions in the adjacent part of the tray.

Additionally, how do you set Ortho in Sketchup? Use the Shift key on the keyboard, to constrain the Line tool to ortho mode.

Also the question is, how do you find the orthographic view?

1. Choose a front view.
2. Decide how many views are needed to completely describe the object.
3. Draw the visible features of the front view.
4. Draw projectors off of the front view horizontally and vertically in order to create the boundaries for the top and right side views.

Considering this, how do you get different views in Sketchup?

1. Select the Zoom tool or press the Z key. You can also select Camera > Field of View from the menu bar.
2. Type a value in degrees or millimeters, respectively. For example, typing 45 deg sets a 45 degree field of view; typing 35 mm sets a focal length equivalent to a 35mm camera.

Click Home tab Ortho Views panel Create Ortho View. In the Select Orthographic Drawing, do one of the following and click OK: Under Orthographic Drawings In the Project, click an existing drawing.

Open LayOut and access your SketchUp model by selecting File > Insert. From here, simply right-click on the SketchUp window and select Scenes: "PLAN". Then right-click and go to Scale = 1mm:50mm. Your scaled plan is now finished in LayOut, and you're all set to start dimensioning and annotating the important details.

Orthographic drawings are also known as multiviews. The most commonly used views are top, front, and right side. You can imagine it as positioning yourself directly in front, above, or to the right of an object and drawing only what you can see.

What is meant by orthographic view?

1 : projection of a single view of an object (such as a view of the front) onto a drawing surface in which the lines of projection are perpendicular to the drawing surface. 2 : the representation of related views of an object as if they were all in the same plane and projected by orthographic projection.

What are the 3 main views of an orthographic drawing?

Although six different sides can be drawn, usually three views of a drawing give enough information to make a three-dimensional object. These views are known as front view, top view and end view. Other names for these views include plan, elevation and section.

What is an example of an orthographic drawing?

Examples of orthographic drawing is often seen in engineering and architecture plans. For example, if an architect were to present a design for a building, they might show a drawing of how the building would look from the front, then another from the side, and so on.

Is orthographic the same as isometric?

Isometric: a method of representing three-dimensional objects on a flat surface by means of a drawing that shows three planes of the object. Orthographic: a method for representing a three-dimensional object by means of several views from various planes.

Is isometric an orthographic?

The isometric is one class of orthographic projections. (In making an orthographic projection, any point in the object is mapped onto the drawing by dropping a perpendicular from that point to the plane of the drawing.)
