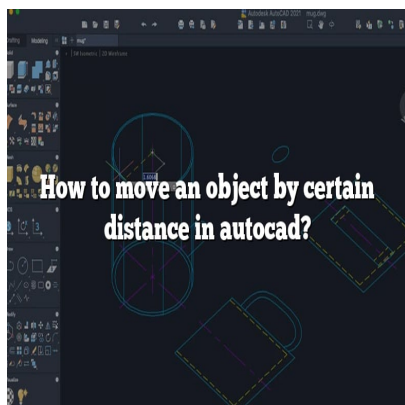

1. Click Home tab Draw panel COGO drop-down COGO Input.
2. In the COGO Input dialog box, select the Bearing/**Distance** routine.
3. For the first point of an object, specify a starting point.
4. Enter the quadrant (NE, SE, SW, NW).
5. Enter the angle.

Likewise, how do you move an **object** on a path in AutoCAD?

1. Click Home tab Modify panel Move. Find.
2. Select the **object** to move.
3. Enter the displacement in the form of a Cartesian, polar, cylindrical, or spherical coordinate value.
4. At the prompt for the second point, press Enter.

What command is used at a specified distance or through a point?

The offset command in AutoCAD is used to create parallel lines, concentric circles, and parallel curves. We can offset any object through a point or at a specified distance.

Object snaps provide a way to specify precise locations on objects whenever you are prompted for a point within a command. For example, you can use object snaps to create a line from the center of a circle to the midpoint of another line.

What is the bearing?

Bearings are parts that assist objects' rotation. They support the shaft that rotates inside the machinery. Machines that use bearings include automobiles, airplanes, electric generators and so on.

How do you drag objects in AutoCAD?

To move objects, select any objects you wish to move and press [Enter]. Two points need to be clicked, the move from point or base point and the move to point. Specify the base point and the second point will indicate how far the objects are to be moved and in what direction.

Which technique is used to move any object in a user defined path?

Answer: Dragging is used to move an object from one position to another position on the computer screen.

How does extend command work in AutoCAD?

The extend command is used to extend the selected boundaries or edges. The objects are extended so that the edges of other objects can be converged. It displays the effect of the Extend command on the figure.

What is Loft command in AutoCAD?

The loft command in AutoCAD is used to create 3D solid or surface. The 3D solid or surface is formed within the space between various cross sections. The cross-sections determine the outer shape of the solid or surface. To create a 3D object using LOFT, we are required to specify at least two cross-sections.

What is the meaning of UCS in AutoCAD?

The user coordinate system (UCS) establishes the location and orientation of a movable Cartesian coordinate system. The UCS is an essential tool for many precision operations. The UCS defines the horizontal and vertical directions used for features like Ortho mode, polar tracking, and object snap tracking.

What is the difference between SNAP and osnap in AutoCAD?

snap is an increment tool, it allows you to move work in specific increments, the increments can be changed at any time. osnap is object snap, snaps to a specific part of an object.

What is snap object?

The Object Snaps (Osnaps for short) are drawing aids which are used in conjunction with other commands to help you draw accurately. Osnaps allow you to snap onto a specific object location when you are picking a point. For example, using Osnaps you can accurately pick the end point of a line or the center of a circle.
