1. In Cinema 4D, right-click in the dark gray area next to the toolbar.
2. In the Name Filter search area, search for PSR or **Reset**.
3. Drag **Reset** PSR to the layout to the point where you want it.
4. To use, select any object, camera, or light, then tap the PSR 0 button.

Likewise, how do you reset octane?

1. 1 Select Menu from the Octaneâ€™s home screen. Select â€œMenuâ€ from the Octaneâ€™s home screen.

2. 2 Select Settings and Tools. Select **Settings** and Tools, and then choose **Phone Settings**.
3. 3 Select Security. Select **Security** and enter the phone's security code.
4. 4 Choose Restore Phone.
5. 5 Wait while the phone restores.

In Cinema 4D, go to Edit, Preferences. Then click **Open Preferences Folder** at the bottom.

In Cinema 4D, you need to click on the right in the dark-gray area next to the toolbar. Then select **customize palette**, a **customize command** and the palette will appear. Use the **Name Filter** search area to look for PSR or Reset. You will notice **Reset PSR** on the list.

To Reduce the polygon, select the **Bend** tool on the toolbar then **Polygon Reduction**. A **Polygon Reduction** object will be added in the object list on the left hand side. You can then edit the **Polygon Reduction** object to set the reduction percentage.

How do you make an object editable in Cinema 4D?

On the other hand, we can also convert any procedural or generated Cinema 4D object into an editable mesh by selecting it and pressing C on the keyboard. We call it "make editable". So I can go and select everything else, press C on my keyboard, and now they're all editable objects.
