

# How to subtract objects in sketchup?

## Description

Sketchup is one of the most popular CAD applications used in companies around the world. This CAD software continues to be a popular and valued CAD alternative; many consider it the industry standard all-purpose engineering tool.

## Introduction

1. Select the **Subtract** tool ( ). Tip: Until you hover over a solid group or component, you see an arrow cursor with a circle and a slash.
2. Click to select the cutting group or component.
3. Click the group or component that you want to cut.

Likewise, how do you subtract multiple **objects** in **SketchUp**? Select all the objects you want to **subtract**. Make them into a group. Edit that group, select all and explode them. You may have to do this multiple times if you have nested groups/components.

Subsequently, how do you subtract non solids in SketchUp?

Best answer for this question, how do you cut **objects** in **SketchUp**?

Beside above, how do you intersect an object in SketchUp?

1. Just select one of the objects, move it by pressing the quick-key **⌘** and place it on the other as you require.
2. Select both objects, right click and select the **Intersect Faces** tab. Here you have two options.
3. And there you have it. We have successfully mated a sphere with a cube.

## How do you boolean in SketchUp?

To start, go to the menu Extensions -> Bool -> Run Bool, or click the Bool button on the toolbar. Once the Bool window opens, you can play with the tools available on the window's toolbar, such as adding and manipulating operations and operands.

## How do you delete part of a group in SketchUp?

Open the group for editing, select the object and use Edit>Cut to cut it out. Exit editing the group and use Edit>Paste in place to paste the object in the same location but outside the group. If the object is a group or component you could do this in Outliner, too.

## How do you edit multiple objects in SketchUp?

Double click to enter edit mode rather than exploding everything. First, you don't need to explode groups or components to make changes. Simply open it for editing. If you had made the shelves copies of a component, editing one will result in all other copies being edited, too.

## How do you make something hollow in SketchUp?

1. Erase the interior to make your design hollow inside: Click on the black "selection" arrow at the far upper right corner of the menu. Then right click the interior of the circle. Click "Erase."
  - You should remain with a hollow "or donut-style" shape.

To split a line or shape, Select the Split tool ( ), which you find on the default toolbar or by selecting Tools > Split from the menu bar. Click on the line or shape edge where you want to split it.

## What is Intersect selection in SketchUp?

Here's what all three modes do:

- *Intersect Faces with Model*: Creates edges everywhere your selected faces intersect with other faces in your model " whether the other faces are selected or not.

1. Open SketchUp.
2. Create two separate grouped objects:
3. Click on a Group and open the Entity Window by clicking Window>Entity Info.
4. Move the groups together so that they intersect each other.
5. Select both groups and CTRL+click on them.
6. Select both Groups and CTRL+click.
