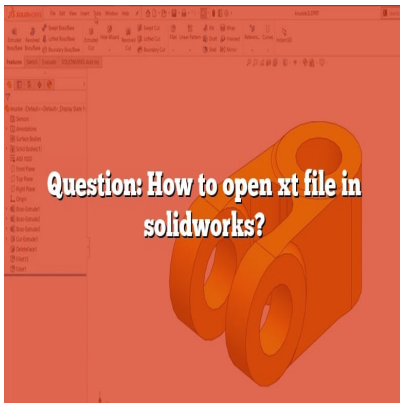

1. Click **File > Open** without a file open.
2. Select Parasolid (.x_t, .xmt_txt, .x_b, .xmt_bin, .x_n, .xmt_neu, .xmt) in the Type box.
3. Click the name of the Parasolid file in a format that you want to import, or browse to find the file and then click the name of the file.
4. Click Import.
5. Click Part or Assembly.

You asked, how do I **open** XT files? X_T files can be opened with Siemens PLM Software called Parasolid. It works on Windows, Linux, and Mac computers. Some other CAD programs that can use this file include Autodesk Fusion 360, VectorWorks, SolidView™s Parasolid Viewer, Kubotek™s KeyCreator, Actify, and 3D-Tool.

Also know, what are XT files? X_T **file** extensions are referred to as both Parasolid Model Part files or modeller transmit files. They™re essentially text-based and used with different CAD programs that read them to identify the geometry, color, and other details of 3D models.

Moreover, can you open .PRT in SolidWorks? prt files can be opened directly by **SolidWorks**. This capability allows you to bypass IGES and STEP, providing you with a cleaner data exchange between SolidWorks and Unigraphics products.

Best answer for this question, does SolidWorks use Parasolid? Parasolid **file** format is native for Parasolid geometrical kernel. Today it is widely used in a range of applications, including **SolidWorks**, SolidEdge, NX, Microstation, Ansys, Abaqus and others.â€•Importâ€• command. In Files of type, select the file format to import. In File Name, select the file name to import. The **file** is imported into the drawing.

1. Autodesk Fusion 360.
2. iOS. Autodesk Fusion 360.
3. Siemens PLM Software Parasolid. Autodesk Fusion 360. Kubotek KeyCreator. Okino Computer Graphics PolyTrans.
4. Siemens PLM Software Parasolid. Autodesk Fusion 360.
5. Linux. Siemens PLM Software Parasolid.
6. Web. Autodesk Fusion 360.

How do I open a Parasolid file in Autocad?

1. Click Insert tab Import panel Import. At the Command prompt, enter import.
2. In the Import File dialog box, in the Files of type box, select (*. x_b, *).
3. Find and select the Parasolid file you want to import, or enter the name of the Parasolid file at File Name.
4. Click Open.
5. Click OK.

How do I open a STP file?

1. Find the STEP file on your computer or device.
2. Double click or right-click and select File > Open.
3. Your file will open with the associated STEP reading software already installed, like Adobe Acrobat.

What formats can SOLIDWORKS open?

1. Drawing Exchange Format (. dxf)
2. Drawing (. dwg)
3. Adobe Photoshop (. psd)
4. Adobe Illustrator (. ai)
5. Parasolid (. x_t)
6. ACIS (. sat)
7. Pro/ENGINEER.
8. Solid Edge.

Can SOLIDWORKS import VRML?

The VRML translator imports all VRML files as SOLIDWORKS part documents. SOLIDWORKS assembly files that you export as VRML files import into SOLIDWORKS as part documents. The VRML translator attempts to knit the VRML polygons into a solid. There are no contoured surfaces in the imported file; all surfaces are planar.

How do I open a .PRT File in SOLIDWORKS 2020?

1. Click Open (Standard toolbar) or File > Open.
2. In the dialog box, set Files of type to Unigraphics (*.prt), then click Options.
3. In the Options dialog box, under General, select or clear: Import multiple bodies as parts.
4. Click OK.
5. Browse to a file, and click Open.

How do I convert Parasolid to SOLIDWORKS?

1. Open the SOLIDWORKS document that you want to export as a Parasolid file.
2. Click File > Save As. The Save As dialog box appears.
3. Set Save as type to Parasolid (*.x_t) or Parasolid Binary (*.x_b).
4. Select from the following options: Option.
5. Click OK, then click Save to export the document.

How do I import a Parasolid file into SOLIDWORKS?

1. Click File > Open without a file open.
2. Select Parasolid (.x_t, .xmt_txt, .x_b, .xmt_bin, .x_n, .xmt_neu, .xmt) in the Type box.
3. Click the name of the Parasolid file in a format that you want to import, or browse to find the file and then click the name of the file.
4. Click Import.
5. Click Part or Assembly.

What is the difference between Parasolid and STEP file?

Parasolids behave differently than STEP. Parasolid allows for surface edges to be defined by adjacent faces. STEP files have rigid, curve-based definitions of face edges. Generally, parasolid is better in SW, as SW is driven by the Parasolid kernel.

In which format a surface model is saved in Solidworks?

Adobe Photoshop (*.psd) Files You can import Adobe® Photoshop® (.psd) files and save SOLIDWORKS data (sketches, parts, assemblies, and drawings) as Adobe Photoshop files.

Can FreeCAD import Parasolid?

What file formats will FreeCAD import? Many of the models on this site are also available in common formats like Iges, Step, Parasolid, SAT. As long as FreeCAD will import some of the common translation formats, you should be OK.

Who uses Parasolid?

Parasolid is a widely used geometry kernel. D-cubed's 2D DCM and 3D DCM are constraint managers. Siemens licenses these components to practically every CAD company in addition to using them in Siemens' own NX and Solid Edge products. This makes them the most widely used CAD components in the world.

What is the use of Parasolid file?

It is used in many Computer-aided design (CAD), Computer-aided manufacturing (CAM), Computer-aided engineering (CAE), Product visualization, and CAD data exchange packages.

What file types can SOLIDWORKS export?

You can export part and assembly files to STL (. stl), 3D Manufacturing Format (. 3mf), or Additive Manufacturing File Format (. amf) format.

How do I import into SOLIDWORKS?

1. Under Task files or folders, click Add File.
2. Select the types of files to import in Files of type. Available selections for file type: IGES (*. igs, *. iges) STEP (*. step, *. stp)
3. Browse to the file you want to import, then click Open.
4. Repeat steps a, b, and c to select additional files.
