To see or change area properties, select an area and see the Properties palette. To see or change area tag properties, select an area tag and see the Properties palette.

How do you load tags in Revit?

1. Click Annotate tab Tag panel drop-down Loaded Tags and Symbols. Depending on the project template, some element categories may have default tags and symbols loaded.
2. Click Load.
3. Navigate to the location of a tag or symbol family.
4. When you are finished loading tags, click OK.

What is cut Geometry in Revit?

With the Cut Geometry tool, you can pick and choose which geometry gets cut and which does not, regardless of when you created the geometry.

How do I make a groove in Revit?

1. Create a void family from a generic template.
2. Place the family on a wall surface.
3. In the Properties palette, use the parameter to adjust the height of the family.
4. After the void family overlaps the column, click Modify tab > Geometry panel > Cut to cut the groove from the column.

How do I create a void floor in Revit?

1. On the Create tab Draw panel, select one of the drawing tools.
2. Click in the drawing area, and draw a closed loop that intersects solid geometry.
3. Select the closed loop.
4. Click Modify | Lines tab Form panel Create Form drop-down (Void Form).

Millwork detail drawings show a small part of the item at a larger scale, to illustrate how the components fit together. A detail requires specific drawing in the case when it differs from standard used in the manufacture or if the detailing is important as the design element.

What is a wall tag?

Wall tags will show the value of your walls type mark. You can change it in the walls type properties. If you do not want to show the wall type in your tag, you can show the material tags. The wall type should have the same interior and exterior finish.

What is a tag in Revit?

A tag is an annotation for identifying elements in a drawing. Every category in the family library has a tag. Some tags automatically load with the default Revit template, while others you need to load. If desired, you can make your own tag in the Family Editor by creating an annotation symbol family.

How do you create a legend in Revit?

1. Click View tab Create panel Legends drop-down (Legend).
2. In the New Legend View dialog, enter a name for the legend view and select the view scale.
3. Click OK.
4. Add the desired element symbols to the view using any of the following methods:
5. Click Annotate tab Text panel (Text).

What is a load tag?

Therefore, load tag information is accurate and correctly identifies the material on the pallet. Each department has their own unique identification tag, allowing shop floor personnel to easily identify which stage of production the pallet of material has been through.

How do you label beams in Revit?

1. Select the beam system in the drawing area.
2. On the Properties palette, under Identity Data, select from the following in the Tag new members in view drop-down: None.
3. Click OK. The selection will confine tags for future members of the beam system to a specific level.
